Blue Family Name

The family name Blue is of Scottish origin. It is not, however, a common name in Scotland, having been found largely in Argyllshire. It is frequently found on tombstones in and around Knapdale, but is seldom seen in other parts of Scotland. The McMillan Clan claims Blue as a Sept of the Clan McMillan. However, there may have been a Clan Blue with its own Coat of Arms. We don't claim to know. "ANGUS BLUE AND HIS DESCENDENTS" was compiled by Oscar Blue McCormick and John Blue in March, 1961. In it they claim Clan Blue is an old clan dating back to Eirch, King of the tribe of Dalraids in the early sixth century. We have not checked the authenticity of their claim. We repeat here much of the text of McCormick and Blue.

The name "Blue" is a translation of MacGhilleghuirm and was originally Gorm (meaning blue). Other Surnames from which Scottish Blues may have come include McGhorm, McGorm, Gille-Gorm, McGHORAM, MacGURMAN, McGUIRMIN, and other spelling variations.

There are Blues other than the Scottish ones who changed their names. BLAU/BLUE is a German nickname, from Old High German blao = blue, and was given in several senses -- the person who almost always wore blue clothing, the man with blue eyes, or the man with the pale or bluish complexion (generally not a sign of good health). Blauer, Blauert are German variations. Plabst, Plab are found in Bavaria. Blauer is also a Jewish variation. Cognate forms also exist in several languages include Blue (English); De Blauw, Blauw, Blauwaert (Flemish); Blaauw (Dutch). The Irish Blues are derived from Belew and similar other spelling that sound similar to Blue.

History (Perhaps)

The Blue family name occurs in the traditions of the Highlanders of the western part of Scotland for nearly one thousands years past. The family was principally located on the Peninsula of Cantyre, the southern division of Argyllshire, opposite Ireland, from whence it is separated by the North Channel. The name appears in Scottish history during the early part of the sixth century. In the year 503 A. D. three sons of Eirch, King of the tribe of Dalraids, namely: LOARM, FERGUS, and ANGUS, carried a considerable body of colonists to CANTYRE. Each of the sons settled in a separate territory. Fergus chose Cantyre, Loarm chose a district to which he gave his name, while Angus was content with the small island of Islay. Both Angus and Loarm died soon thereafter, leaving Fergus sole monarch of the Dalradic Scots. It is said that Fergus himself died in the year 606 A. D., his sovereignty passing to his son, DOMANCAR. The latter reigned 5 years, and left two sons, CONEGAL and GAURAN. This GAURAN being the Gaelic of the name BLUE. GAURAN was slain in battle with BIRDIE, a son of MALCOLM, king of the Picts. His descendents remained in possession of Cantyre and ruled the western part of Scotland for the next three hundred years. In the ear 836, KENNETH, descendent of GAURAN, became the ruler and six years later made good his claim to the throne of the entire kingdom north of the TYNE. Thus Scotland, for the first time, was united under one hand. The succession continued in the GAURAN family for the next 260 years. In the course of time the Scottish name GAURAN was changed to GHORM, or McGHORM. It is not known at what precise time, or

for what reason the Gaelic name of the family was dropped, and the English synonym of BLUE adopted. It may possibly have occurred in the time of James VI, when Scotland passed under the crown of England. The immediate ancestors of ANGUS BLUE were of Celtic origin and descended from the hardy Highlanders of Scotland. In religious faith they were Protestants, being Presbyterians of the John Knox School. They were also rigid covenanters, and had their full share of persecution for their political opinions.

When Charles Stuart landed in Scotland to assert and maintain his rights to the throne, the Blues were among those who rallied to him resolved to do so or die for the young prince. It resulted in disaster to their own fortunes, as well as to the cause of Charles. They participated in the disastrous battle of Culloden, April 16, 1746, which forever extinguished the hope of the unfortunate prince, causing him to flee for France. In order to escape the persecution and punishment so mercilessly meted out to the insurgents, large numbers of Scots emigrated to America. They had heard about the sunny climate, cheap land, and rich soil of North Carolina. Governor Gabriel Johnson, who was a Scotsman, and the High-Assembly wanted new settlers for the colony and welcomed the Highlanders. Before 1775 about twenty thousand Scots came and settled along the Upper Cape Fear River.

In the several generations of the Blue family or families that came to America from 1748 to 1804 there are five families in all. The first family arrived from North Knapdale about the year 1748 and settled at Longstreet church, Cumberland County, N. C. about 12 miles from Fayetteville in a westwardly direction. The old Blue homestead is now a part of the Fort Bragg reservation. Although this is not our line of Blues, no doubt they were related in ancestry. Most of the Scots followed the Cape Fear River upstream and out its tributaries where the land was most fertile.

Our family ancestors settled on Drowning Creek, at a point now known as Blue's Bridge. They operated a mill there. On the opposite side of the creek lived Rev. John McIntyre, pastor of Bethesda church. He was a native of Scotland also, born in 1760 and died in 1863. He was educated at Salemn Grove Academy, near Bethesda church, Aberdeen, N. C. The Blues were members of Bethesda church.

An account of the Blue families that came to North Carolina is given in the following newspaper clipping:

*Brief History of the Blue Family
Compiled by D. Al Blue, July 1938*

In the several generations of the Blue family or "families" that came to America in 1748 to 1804 there are five families in all. They all came from Argyllshire, Scotland. The first family to arrive from North Knapdale about the year 1748 settled at Longstreet Church, Cumberland County, NC about 13 miles from Fayetteville in a westerly direction. The old Blue homestead is now a part of the Fort Bragg reservation. The head of the family was Malcolm Blue whose descendants are many and numerous in several of the southern states. Representative of this family are Dr. Rupert Blue Washington DC, Surgeon General in President Wilson's Administration and Admiral Victor Blue, now deceased.

The next family to come over was Duncan Blue, about the year 1769. Duncan Blue married Margaret Campbell before coming to this country. They had six children, three boys and three girls. The oldest son John was born September 1765 in Argyllshire, Scotland. The other children were as follows: Patrick Blue and Duncan Campbell Blue, the girls were Catherine, Sarah and Effie. It is not known to this writer whether any of the other children were born in Scotland or not. The family came over with the McNeill colony to Wilmington, NC and thence up to Fayetteville (the Campbell town) thence up Little Creek to what is now Lakeview, NC Some of the descendents of Duncan Blue and his wife Margaret Campbell still own and live on part of the old estate at Lakeview which has been in the family for more than one hundred and fifty years. They have in their possession a land Grant for a tract of land they now own with the signature of KING George III (1770).

Not until a full generation after the Revolutionary war were there any Scotch settlers that came to (America) this section. It was in the year 1800 that the next family of Blues came over. This family settled

in Pine Bluff, NC. The old mill pond is still kept up and is now used as a swimming pool. This family moved south about the year 1830 and scattered over several of the southern states. There are several doctors now living in Montgomery, Ala. Who are descendents of this family.

Three years later about 1803 the family known as the Bridge Blues came over and settled on Drowning Creek near "Blues Bridge." The head of this family was Daniel Blue.

In 1804 Donald Blue and family sailed on the ship 'Pandora' landing in Wilmington, NC. Donald Blue married Christian Lammonds North Knapdale, Scotland. Malcolm Leach of North Knapdale married Donald Blue's (my print is not readable here). The two families came over together and made their way up Wade Creek and Little River where they settled. The Leach family after living with the Blue family for one year moved up and settled on Cabbin Creek about four miles east of Star, NC.

All the different families of Blues that came to America and settled in North Carolina from 1748 to 1804 came from Argyllshire on the Peninsula Cantyre opposite Ireland from which it is separated by the North Channel. Of course, there are several other families of the name who came from Scotland at different times to the United States. Donald Blue who came to America in 1804 and settled on Wade Creek and Little River, a brother Malcolm who came to America in 1803 and settled in ONEDA COUNTY, NEW YORK. Then there were other families who settled in other states but as far as the writer knows, they all were from the same place in Scotland and evidently related in one way or another.

THE FAMILY

The format used here is one adopted from Blue files of William H. Blue. It is an adaptation from technical report format. By counting the number of numbers between the dots you can tell the generation to which the descendent belongs. An asterisk at between the end of the descendents number and his/her name indicates that more information about that individual will appear in the next generation's section. Relationships can be determined between two individuals by noting the first common ancestor from comparing the individual numbers. The letter A after the S that denotes Scottish indicates an adopted individual or the offspring of an adopted line. I believe it is important to recognize adopted children as mine are adopted. For genealogy purists these SA individuals can be dropped.

Because of the large family size we divide the Bridge Blue Family into sections defined by the children of the **second generation family head, Daniel Blue, Sr.** The sections beginning with GENERATION THREE are then:

FIRST GENERATION of the Bridge Blues

S6. Angus BLUE (1733-June 15, 1823), m. Flora _____ (1746-March 29, 1827). He was born in Scotland, apparently a native of the Isle of Jura in Argyllshire. Flora also was born in Scotland and died in Moore Co. NC. They came to NC ca1803, and settled near Blue's Bridge (then called Coleman's Bridge) on Drowning Creek in Moore Co. Both are buried at the Old Bethesda Presbyterian Cemetery, Aberdeen, Moore Co. Angus wrote a will, dated 28 Aug 1818, which is on file at the Moore Co. Courthouse. This Blue family was said to be 'rough' and were sometimes called the 'CUSSING BLUES', to distinguish them from the [S1.] and [S4.] Blue families who were all staid Presbyterians. They were great moneymakers and keen traders'. Reference B16 says he died 1828, age 90. This may be a case of someone confusing a '3' and an '8' on the gravestone.

She was a daughter of Hugh McLaurin who left a will dated 26 Jul 1817 in Richmond Co. NC. Catherine is mentioned in this will. Daniel and Catherine lived near Blue's Bridge, Aberdeen NC. He lived on Pee Dee Road a short distance from Blue's Bridge which was later called Coleman's Bridge and then Graham's Bridge. He was a prosperous man and was called 'The Bank' by people around Aberdeen. Daniel and Catherine are buried at Old Bethesda Cemetery, Aberdeen, Moore Co.

Blue Cemetery). They both were born in NC. In about 1840 they migrated to MS where he purchased 1280 acres of land. Part of the land (160 acres) is the land records listed as Daniel Blew. They were living in Chickasaw Co. MS in 1850 and in Calhoun Co. MS in 1860. This does not necessarily indicate a move, for Calhoun Co. was formed partly from Chickasaw Co. in 1852. Daniel's granddaughter, Martha Kellum (1880 census), lived with Daniel after Mary died. Daniel was the first postmaster at Erin in Chickasaw Co. Daniel gave the land which was donated for Young's Chapel to his daughter, Sarah. Sarah "Sallie" married Thomas W. Young, son of Thomas Jefferson Young who was the first pastor of Young's Chapel. A story passed down in the family is that he died one night after eating a large bucket of plums that his grandchildren had gathered that day.

Sucey, Mime, Issac during her lifetime and after her death Said Negroes to be Equally among my Grand Children, Viz. John Blue, Mary Blue, Isabella Blue, Christian Blue,, Florah Blue, Sarah Blue, Archibald Blue, Daniel Blue and Malcolm Blue. Third I give and bequeath after my wife Florah's death the other half of my land and Plantation to the afore said John Blue and thereby Make and Ordain my Worthy friend John McGregor and my Dear beloved John Blue executors of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I the (undersigned?) Graham, all My Stock of Horses and Mules, Cattle, Hogs and Sheep My household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils all the Money on hand at my death and all the Debts then due me by Bonds notes on open accounts upon the conditions that he Suport and maintain his mother Catherine Blue as long as She lives, Suport and maintain My Daughter Christian as long as She lives a Single woman and no longer, and pay the following Legacies hereinafter except the one given to my wife Catherine now paid her:

Item Second I Will and Bequeath to my wife Catherine Eight Hundred Dollars which Sum I have this day given her for her Sole and Separate use in payment for this Legacy and hereby discharge My Son Malcolm from the payment of the Same.

Item Third I Will and Bequeath to my Daughter Christian Eight Hundred Dollars to be paid her out of my Estate by my Executor hereinafter named.

Item fourth I will and Bequeath to my Son John Blue fifteen hundred Dollars to be paid by my Executor

Item fifth I will and Bequeath to my Son Daniel Blue fifteen huhdred Dollars to be paid by my Executor

Item sixth. I will and Bequeath to my Executor hereinafter named In Trust for my Son Archibald's children fourteen hundred Dollars to be expended for the Suport and Maintenance of Said Archibald Blue's children Share and Share alike as in his descretion there need May require.

Item seventh I will and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary McGugan Wife of John McGugan one dollar having already given her and husband their Share or portion of My Estate.

Item ninth I give and Bequeath to each of My Daughter Sarah McGilvary's Children who may arrive at the age of twenty-one years the sum of One hundred Dollars each to be paid them by my Executor hereinafter named.

Item tenth I leave in the hands of my executor hereinafter to be named Eight Hundred Dollars to be by him applied according to his discretion and necessarily may require to the use and benefit of My daughter Flora McFarlan and Should be My Executor deem it advisable So to do he may lay on the Whole or any part of that Amount in the purchase of Land for the use of My Said Daughter Flora Which Land if this purchase Shall Vest at her death in the hheirs of her body if any, then living But if not that Said Land Belong to her next of Kin and Share alike and my Executor to take title the land Accordingly.

I hereby nominate and appoint my son Malcolm Blue Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and and annulling all other wills and testaments heretofore Made and published by me ratifying and confirming this as my last will and Testament in Testimony Whereof I have unto Let my hand and Seal this the 21st day of July 1842.
